Based on § 2 para. 3 of the Regulatory Framework for Bachelor's and Master's Degree Programmes at Zurich University of the Arts of 2 November 2021, the University Board hereby decrees:

A. **General Provisions**

Subject

In addition to the Regulatory Framework for Bachelor's and Master's Degree Programmes at ZHdK (RF), the Degree Programme Regulations (DPR) set out here govern the Master of Arts in Specialized Music Performance.

Programme Objective

¹ The Master of Arts in Specialized Music Performance enables students to deepen their specialized artistic-musical skills, which will meet the highest technical and interpretive standards. Coursework focuses on the interpretation and performance of music as an instrumentalist, vocalist, conductor, performance artist, lied duo or ensemble in duo to quartet formations on international stages.

² The master's programme leads to a professional qualification.

Majors in Music Performance

- ¹ The master's degree programme comprises the following majors:
- Major in Choral Conducting (90 Credits); a.
- Major in Contemporary Music (90 Credits); h.
- Major in Conducting (90 Credits); C.
- Major in Ensemble (90 Credits); d.
- Major in Piano Chamber Music (90 Credits); e.
- Major in Lied Duo (90 Credits); f.
- Major in Lied Interpretation (90 Credits); g.
- Major in Orchestra (90 Credits); h.
- Major in Soloist (90 Credits);
- ² The Annexes to these DPR describe the MA majors in Specialized Music Performance.

В. **Admissions**

Admissions

Programme admissions are governed by the provisions of the Regulatory Framework (RF).

Admissions Process and Entrance Examination Committee

¹ The admissions process comprises four stages:

- The University Office establishes whether applicants meet the University's admissions requirements (i.e. previous education, fulfilment of additional requirements, language proficiency and application documents);
- Applications are reviewed to verify whether applicants fulfil the admissions requirements for the subject-specific aptitude test;
- The Entrance Examination Committee verifies whether applicants fulfil the additional c. requirements and conducts the subject-specific aptitude test;
- Admissions decision. d.

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² The Head of Programme appoints an Entrance Examination Committee for every major. Committees comprising at least one person (professor or lecturer) from the degree programme and the Head of Major.

6. Evidence of Language Proficiency

- ¹ Students seeking admission to the majors listed below must provide evidence of an adequate knowledge of either German or English:
- a. Contemporary Music,
- b. Conducting,
- c. Ensemble.
- d. Piano Chamber Music,
- e. Lied Duo.
- f. Lied Interpretation,
- g. Orchestra,
- h. Soloist.
- ² Students seeking admission to the Major in Choral Conducting must provide evidence of an adequate knowledge of German and English.
- ² Students can demonstrate their adequate knowledge of German in one of the following ways:
- a. Native speaker;
- b. German as a subject that was examined as part of their previous education (passed or at least grade 4);
- c. B2 certificate in German that was earned under the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) or
- d. A university degree (BA/MA) in a programme that was taught and examined in German.
- ⁵ Students can demonstrate their adequate knowledge of English in one of the following ways:
- Native speaker;
- b. English as a subject that was examined as part of their previous education (passed or at least grade 4);
- c. B2 certificate in English that was earned under the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) or
- d. A university degree (BA/MA) in a programme that was taught and examined in English.
- ⁴ Proof of the required language skills can be provided in the first two semesters. In this case, programme admission is subject to students providing evidence of their language proficiency at the latest by the end of their second semester. Students who fail to meet the language requirements may be expelled.

7. Verification

The University Office reviews the documents listed below to verify whether applicants meet the admissions requirements (previous education, additional requirements, language proficiency):

- a. Application form;
- b. Portfolio (Major in Conducting, incl. video),
- c. Motivation letter;
- d. Bachelor's degree in accordance with the RF, as well as previous education certificates in accordance with the RF and overarching legislation.

8. Admission to Subject-Specific Aptitude Test

Students who fulfil the requirements set out in § 7 and who have submitted the required application documents are admitted to the subject-specific aptitude test.

9. Subject-Specific Aptitude Test

- ¹ The subject-specific aptitude test has two parts.
- ² The first part of the aptitude test involves the assessment of the application documents. The positive assessment of these documents is a prerequisite for applicants being invited to the second part of the aptitude test.

Students seeking admission to the Major in Conducting will be preselected based on their video presentation (to be submitted with their application).

- ³ The second part of the aptitude test comprises:
- a. Artistic-musical performance,
- b. Admissions interview.

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10. Assessment Criteria

The following criteria are used to assess candidate aptitude:

- a. Artistic potential,
- b. Musical-creative abilities and skills,
- c. Innovation potential,
- d. Motivation,
- e. Independence and personal responsibility,
- f. Reflective thinking skills and self-assessment,
- g. Communications skills and social competence,
- h. Quality of portfolio.

C. Programme Organisation

11. Programme Duration

As a rule, the programme takes four to a maximum of six semesters to complete.

D. Student Performance

12. Credit Requirements

The number of credits required to pass the majors governed by these regulations is stipulated in the respective programme structures (see Annexes).

¹ The following criteria are used to assess student performance:

- a. Musical-artistic creative ability,
- b. Instrumental, vocal and conducting technique,
- c. Stage presence,
- d. Artistic quality,

- j. Theoretical and historical knowledge.

E. Graduation

12. Major Graduation Requirements

- ¹ Students seeking to graduate with a Major in Choral Conducting must fulfil the following requirements:
- a. Preliminary degree exam,
- b. Public choir project.
- ² Students seeking to graduate with a Major in Contemporary Music must fulfil the following requirements:
- a. Conception, documentation and public presentation of the master's project,
- b. Individual portfolio.
- ³ Students seeking to graduate with a Major in Conducting must fulfil the following requirements:
- a. Assistantships,
- b. Conception, documentation and public presentation of the master's project.
- ⁴ Students seeking to graduate with a Major in Ensemble, Piano Chamber Music, Lied Duo, Lied Interpretation and Orchestra must fulfil the following requirements:

⁴ Programme admission is subject to the positive overall assessment of the application documents and of candidates' performance at the subject-specific aptitude test.

⁵ Candidates who fail their subject-specific aptitude test may repeat this only once for any degree programme.

² These criteria are assessed in terms of the programme outcomes stipulated in the Annex.

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- a. Repertoire exam,
- b. Public recital.
- ⁵ Students seeking to graduate with a Major in Soloist must fulfil the following requirements:
- Preliminary degree exam,
- b. Public recital or solo concert with orchestra.
- ⁶ The Head of Programme appoints an examination committee for each examination, comprising one person (professor or lecturer) and at least one person (professor or lecturer) from the degree programme or an expert.
- ³ Students who wish to graduate must be awarded a "Pass" or at least a grade of 4.0.
- ⁴ Students who are awarded a "Fail" or a grade below 4.0 may repeat their final examinations only once, at the next possible examination date.

12. Copyright Ownership

- ¹ Copyright in all inventions, designs and copyrighted works created in degree programmes is owned by ZHdK.
- ² ZHdK reserves the right to decide on the licensing and transfer of intellectual property rights.

G. Final Provisions

12. Enactment

- ¹ These Degree Programme Regulations were enacted on 1 February 2024.
- ² These Regulations apply to all students who enter their programme in the 2024/25 autumn semester or thereafter.

12. Transitional Provision

- ¹ Master's students who began their studies before the 2024/25 autumn semester will graduate from their programme in accordance with the Degree Programme the ZHdK Master of Arts in Music Performance, Master of Arts in Specialized Music Performance, the Master of Arts in Music Pedagogy and the Master of Arts in Composition and Theory of 7 February 2018 and with the respective curricular concept.
- ² In accordance with previous legislation, students must complete their degree programme before the end of the maximum period of study.
- ³ Students who interrupt their studies are subject to the new legislation. The terms and conditions of resumption as well as the accreditation of previous achievements are governed by § 34 of the Regulatory Framework for Bachelor's and Master's Programmes.
