Rational of the event

Swiss higher education is known to be of very high quality. Despite of this, there is room for reflection and usually also for adjustments in view of providing students and staff with competences needed to solve global challenges and act as “glocal” citizens. In addition, educational institutions themselves continuously self-develop to be ready to cope with current and future challenges with impact on them, such as the Covid-19 pandemic or the influx of refugee students.
